

### **Khanyisa Admission Process:**

It is required:

- that you have a clear understanding of the type of education that we offer at Khanyisa School before you commit to us.
- that we can meet the needs of your child before we commit to you.
- that you complete the application form, answer all the questions and make sure that the form is signed.

We require the following supporting documents to process your child's application:

- A copy of your child's birth certificate
- A copy of Mother's ID document
- A copy of the Father's ID document
- A copy of your child's educational psychological report (not older than two years)
- A copy of your child's most recent school report
- A copy of any other medical and/or therapy reports and/or assessments

### **What Happens Next?**

- **Interview:** When we have received all your documentation and established the possibility of a place in the class, the teacher will review the applications on the waiting list with the faculty before arranging an interview with your child and yourself. Acceptance is not guaranteed. After the interview, the application will be reviewed at a faculty meeting, considering the needs of the class, as well as the needs of the applying child before a decision of acceptance, is made. The application may even be referred to the College of Teachers if need be.  
A non-refundable fee of R450 must be paid before the interview
  - Three-Day Trial: Upon application acceptance, your child will then be invited to attend a three-day trial period in the class. Following this, your child will be assessed by the class teacher in literacy, mathematics, and general knowledge. This is done to ensure that we can meet your child's learning requirements. You will be notified in writing on the day after the 3-day trial if your child has been accepted.
  - Two-Month Probation: Your child then enters a two-month probation period. There will be a short financial interview with the Bursar. A credit check will be made. Most learning challenges are accompanied by other factors, which can include social, emotional, and behavioural issues. The probation period allows more time for further assessments, to offer a deeper understanding of the child's learning problem and an opportunity to observe the child in a social and academic environment. This enables the teachers to see whether or not our programme can fully comply with the child's specific requirements.
